

Special issue: The Lasallian Gathering of the World Youth Day 2016 in Krakow!

Discover in the next few pages everything there is to know about the event of the year in the Young Lasallians Movement. More than 400 people made the trip to the gathering, which was held during the World Youth Day (WYD) in Krakow, Poland, the encounter of more than a million young people from the whole universal Church. The theme of the gathering was the same as the WYD's, "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy" (Mt 5:7)







A brief summary

It is now a tradition for the Young Lasallians to organize a gathering whenever the Church celebrates the World Youth Day. This makes it possible to count every two or three years on an event that is an opportunity for young people from all over the world to experience the international nature of the Lasallian Family and deepen their commitment to the Mission.

This year, over 400 people from twenty different countries were invited during an afternoon in the parish of St. John Cantius to meet, share and pray together. Welcomed by the parish priest and the Brother Auxiliary Visitor of the District of Poland, young people also had the chance to hear Brother Robert Schieler, Superior General, talk to them about mercy, and what it means to be merciful in a Lasallian perspective.

Then there was a long moment when young people were able to discuss and share their personal vocation story and their experience in the Lasallian Mission. This was followed by a presentation on the Fratelli Project, which attends refugee children in Lebanon, and then by a moment of prayer. When the time came to conclude this short and intense celebration, one could read through the bursts of joy and the fraternal accolades that the Lasallian Gathering had been great success for all.

For the curious, here is the list of countries of origin of the young people who participated in the event. It should be mentioned that 35 Brothers from different countries were present, including the General Councillors Br. Aidan Kilty and Br. Rafa Matas.






Stories that come out of the ordinary!
