

Novitiate in Nairobi (Kenya): Beginning of religious life and habit taking ceremony

As part of the celebration of the feast of Saint Mutien-Marie, on 30th November at 5.00 pm, the Novitiate in Nairobi was decked out for the occasion. With the presence of Brother Moses Abunya, Auxiliary Visitor of the Lwanga District of Africa, and several Brothers from the Scholasticate Community in Nairobi, **the Novitiate Community in Nairobi (Kenya) celebrated the Eucharist to**
